1. Unite the socialist left and transform the Labour party -

1. Campaign to democratise the Labour Party and comprehensively reform its structures, organisation, and culture to revitalise it as a campaigning force at all levels.

2. Democratise Local Campaign Forums and Regional Boards to allow meaningful representation and to support members to lead campaigns in local communities.
49 for; 4 against; 3 abstained
3. Work across the left to build a united slate for the NEC elections, aiming to involve members as much as possible in deciding our candidates

4. Ballot all Momentum members on socialist policies to put forward at Labour Party conference and actively campaign around the policies developed and prioritised by members.

9. Develop a radical programme of municipal socialism for local government, fight cuts and democratise services and decision-making, working with a strengthened Councillor Network.

10. Hold Momentum councillors to account over their commitments to socialist politics and opposition to austerity.

11. Support community campaigns against gentrification and unpopular housing developments.

12. Campaign to defend and build upon Labour's 2019 manifesto of socialist policies, such as the Green New Deal, defending the NHS, nationalisation of utilities, repealing all anti-trade union laws, closing detention centres and defending migrant rights.

14. Campaign to extend the Brexit transition period

2. Refound Momentum and put members in charge -

1. Refound Momentum through a member-led participatory process, involving deliberation on a new digital platform and in local groups, a refounding convention in May 2021 producing recommendations, and a final all-member ballot to decide how members will have a say over the organisation in future and rewriting the constitution.

2. Members should select, by all-member vote, Momentum's candidates for major internal Labour Party elections e.g. Leader and NEC (subject to negotiation with other groups as appropriate).

3. Ensure local groups decide which local candidates Momentum backs to become Councillors and PPCs.

4. Build solidarity across communities and foster joined-up democratic self-organisation in BAME, LGBTQ, womens and Disability Momentum sections to formulate a coherent fight against bigotry, oppression and exploitation of working people.

5. Create a democratically-run Momentum BAME members network to support BAME self-organisation, build BAME power and promote BAME leadership. Provide training, skill sharing, and political education particularly for BAME members.

6. The NCG should meet monthly, using online meeting spaces as appropriate, but at least four times a year in person, with adequate staff support to run smoothly.

7. Each NCG member should be allocated as a key contact for a number of groups and all NCG members should have a publicly available Momentum email so that members can suggest ideas and proposals to be raised on the NCG.

8. The minutes of each NCG meeting should be circulated among the members.

9. The NCG Officers Group should be elected by the full NCG every year on a recallable basis and its decisions ratified by the NCG.

13. Reinvigorating regional networks with annual regional all-member conferences to build networks and to coordinate on campaigns and on the Refounding Momentum process.

14. Regional conferences to elect some representation to the NCG. (If regional conferences are agreed - see previous proposal)

15. Empower members to lead campaigns at local and national levels and to propose and select priorities for national and regional campaigns.

16. Create vibrant interest-based sections such as Momentum Teachers or Momentum Climate Justice.
48 for; 6 against; 2 abstained
17. Foster an open and inclusive environment in our movement with a vibrant culture of debating and exploring political ideas and of mutual learning and development.
50 for; 2 against; 4 abstained
18. Data must be controlled democratically by the NCG. Up to four NCG members will be elected by the NCG to act as directors of the holding company that owns the data. In this role, they will be accountable to the NCG, whose right of control over the data will be enshrined in Momentum's constitution.

19. Create greater avenues for youth involvement and representation in Momentum, such as a democratic, self-organised youth section and specific campaigns.

3. Turn members into organisers to build power in our communities and workplaces

1. Give every member, from new to experienced activists, access to the political education and skills training needed to develop as organisers, with a particular focus on building up young, BAME, and working-class activists to become leaders in our movement.

2. Organise at least one national campaign each year in partnership with other organisations. Members from across the country should be involved in developing the goals, strategy and approach of this campaign and member-led activity, involving large numbers of members, should be a key part of how this campaign will win. Use this to develop members' skills and organisational capacity.

3. Put Momentum's resources and digital tools at the service of members to support campaigning at local, regional, and national levels, and to work together in meaningful partnership with other organisations including trade, community, and tenants' unions and CLPs to achieve change.

4. Form a trade union section/network in Momentum through which trade unionists can coordinate to support members to get involved in trade unions and to develop

members' skills as organisers and campaigners. This network will have an elected national full-time officer to support the network.

5. Coordinate nationally with trade union broad left sections on campaigns and on policy making within the Labour Party.

6. Encourage the election of TULOs in local Momentum groups and groups to build robust links and coordinate with local trade union branches.

15. Organise accessible political education initiatives targeted beyond the membership to help grow our movement.

4. Hand power to local groups, nations and regions

1. Aim to move the central office out of London in long term, beginning with identifying a northern city within 3 months and open with a core team within a year.

2. Aim to establish small regional offices across the country over the next 2 years.

3. Prioritise resources for local Momentum groups, including access to membership data and funds. Provide guidance and support from central to help them organise and take action.

4. Momentum must ensure national campaigns work in partnership with the devolved areas. Campaigns need to reflect where powers are devolved or not.

10. Empower democratic regional networks to coordinate and link up activity across autonomous local groups.

campaigns, with decisions on funding made by other local groups in the region.

5. Campaign for a just, green, post-Coronavirus deal

1. Develop and launch a member-led campaign in partnership with a or several trade and tenants' unions and local campaigns to ensure that working people don't pay the price for the public-health and economic crises – and to fight against redundancies, evictions, cuts and other forms of exploitation. E.g.1 a campaign in partnership with the NEU and in support of teachers to keep schools from reopening. E.g.2 a campaign in partnership with the tenants unions to defend people facing unfair evictions in the wake of lockdown.

2. Team up with Mutual Aid groups and support them to organise and mobilise support for permanent community-based projects and for campaigns against exploitation in communities across the UK.
